## **BIOGRAPHY**

Rosie Murnku Marnku Tasman was the older sister of Molly Napurrurla Tasman. They painted together in Lajamanu throughout their career. Rosie was a tiny lady full of knowledge about her stories, which is shown in the painting she created throughout her life. She was a caring dedicated lady who grew up in the Tanami Desert and walked along her story lines. Her depth of character and the hardships she has endured in her life were the impetus for her beautiful Dreamtime paintings. Characteristic of her style was the use of colourful bold linework and dots. Tasman's love and dedication to Warlpiri culture and family is born out in the art she created. Her work has been widely exhibited in Australia and overseas. Notably, she was a finalist in the 2010 Telstra National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Art Awards. She is included in various major collections, among them the National Gallery of Victoria and Artbank.
